2015 Activity & Achievements:

We currently have one member as part of the Board, Kevin Ellyett, who is now in the role of Chair of the Board. There are 52 New Zealand branch members, eight of which joined in 2015.

This year we were lucky enough to have Dr John Brannan from NSW as our guest speaker for our NZ branch meeting held in Queenstown. John gave two excellent talks on bronchial provocation challenges and assessment of airways disease for the ANZSRS and TSANZ members. Thanks again for making the trip over and presenting your research for us! Overall the annual NZ branch meeting was once again a great success receiving excellent feedback from most members.

In 2015 Ewan Morris performed an audit of respiratory testing around the country and the findings are summarized below:

- All respondents perform full PFT's and majority offer bronchodilator, CPET and some sort of provocation testing
- 40.5 FTE across the respondents, the average is 2.5 per lab (wide variation), the average per 100,000 population is 1.06
- At the time of the survey approximately 10% of all FTE was vacant
- All staff are employed under some sort of union agreement
- The majority of staff are educated to postgraduate level
- At the time there were 27 physiologists with CRFS, only 5 of which were not employed at a tertiary centre. 5 DHB's were performing full PFT's without a Certified scientist
- 7 DHB's offer either no formal training or only attend formal spirometry training/refreshers at a tertiary centre
- Training usually supervised by Senior physiologists who have either Masters/PhD, 8/11 trainers hold CRFS
- At the time 5 labs held accreditation with TSANZ

Average number of respiratory physicians in service was 5. 1-3 physicians
9 DHBs, 4-7 = 5 DHBs, 8-10 = 3 DHBs. Average ratio of physiologists: physicians = 1:3

The Respiratory Laboratories around the country continue to put up interesting cases for Library Corner and Case of the Month. This has been shared around numerous laboratories so we had a range of input and we hope this will continue to the same level for this coming year.
